## Animal Science Accreditation An Update from the Animal Science Council on Accreditation March 2022

Your Council on Accreditation has been busy since it was formalized and officially began its work following the ASAS National Meeting in 2021. The topic of Accreditation of Animal Science Programs has been discussed for a long time within the ASAS community and the Council is happy to see implementation of the Accreditation Process is in the launch phase. We recognize that there will be challenges and unanticipated questions that need to be answered during the initial launch of this program but are excited to open the application process this year. The Council recognizes that institutions require time to prepare for submitting an application and or implement required elements of the Standards. The number of applicants to proceed through the process will be limited in number initially to make sure the process is working both for the applicants and the Council. Now is a good time to prepare and let the Council know if you intend to submit an application this year or next.

There are a number of new documents on this site that we encourage all who are interested in this program to review. These are thought to be especially useful if you and your institution are wondering if accreditation may be right for your program, or are wondering what is involved in the application for accreditation.

The membership of your Animal Science Council on Accreditation is listed among the online resources. Terms on the Council are 3 years in length and renewable for an additional term. There will be at least one opening for a new member beginning at the 2022 ASAS National Meeting for an academic representative. Please review and submit the application form if you are interested. The applications are reviewed by the Council members and appointments to the Council are made by the ASAS Board of Directors.
