The 2007 Western Section of the American Society of Animal Science (WSASAS) meeting will be held at the University of Idaho, Moscow, on June 20-22 (Beef Symposium on June 20). Please note the following important dates and information with respect to this meeting:

March 1, 2007 Nominations for the WSASAS Distinguished Service, Young Scientist, Distinguished Teacher, and Extension Awards should be submitted via the WSASAS website by this date. Please take this opportunity to nominate individuals at your institution or company that are doing outstanding work and deserve recognition.

March 1, 2007 Abstracts should be prepared and submitted electronically as instructed on the WSASAS 2007 meeting website (<http://www.asas.org/western07/>). **All abstracts submitted require a manuscript for publication in the WSASAS Proceedings. No abstracts will be published without the submission of the proceedings paper.** Please ensure that abstracts conform to Quality Standards for Abstracts found on the meeting website (<http://www.asas.org/western07/>). **Only LCD projectors will be used for presenting visual aids in oral presentations.**

April 5, 2007 Manuscripts for the WSASAS Proceedings (Volume 58) should be submitted electronically no later than this date. Instructions for preparation and submission of the manuscript can be found on the WSASAS 2007 meeting home page (<http://www.asas.org/western07/>). Manuscripts are suggested to be four pages in length. Page charges (\$20.00 per page) *must* be submitted at the same time as the manuscript (no later than April 5, 2007). Complete details can be found on the Invoice for Page Charges. The invoice and publication approval form can be found on the above listed web site and **must be mailed** to Dr. Richard Battaglia, **by April 5, 2007**. Checks should be made payable to: Western Section, American Society of Animal Science, c/o Dr. Richard Battaglia at the address above.

The Applied Animal Science Award, sponsored by industry, is a regular award of the Western Section. The awards are selected from proceedings papers submitted for publication in the WSASAS proceedings based on the criteria of: 1) applicability to current production systems, 2) potential for economic return on investment, and 3) new and innovative approaches to existing production problems. The papers will be evaluated and selected by a committee of industry and academic animal agriculture consultants appointed and chaired by the WSASAS Industry Representative. **Persons interested in having their proceedings paper reviewed by this committee for this award must email an electronic file of the proceedings paper by April 5, 2007 (this is in addition to the electronic paper submitted on the web) directly to:** Gary K.
