# CANADIAN JOURNAL OF ANIMAL SCIENCE LAUNCHES METHODS SECTION



The Canadian Journal of Animal Science (CJAS) is pleased to invite submissions for Methods, a new article type for the journal comprising research papers describing and validating new and/or improved methods or procedures in animal science. Papers can address new methodologies, provide significant updates to existing ones, or explore applications of existing methods to new models or scientific questions.

By having a dedicated section for Methods papers, CJAS will enable researchers to share the development and application of new animal science methods in more detail and facilitate their replication and use.

Methods papers can be drawn from any area of animal science and must meet the following criteria:

- 1. The new or modified method must be compared with existing protocols to suggest the work presents an advance or confers an advantage over existing methods; and
- 2. Experimental protocols and timelines must be clearly outlined, and the data analyzed statistically.
