

Dr. Clay Mathis was named Director and Endowed Chair of the King Ranch® Institute for Ranch Management in July, 2010. As Director, Dr. Mathis leads faculty and staff appointed to the King Ranch® Institute for Ranch Management and oversees teaching and outreach efforts of the Institute. He maintains and develops curriculum for the M.S. in Ranch Management degree program, which includes more than 42 hours of business and animal production coursework and intensive project work tackling issues on large partnering
