

Minutes of Business Meeting of the Southern Section  
AMERICAN SOCIETY OF ANIMAL PRODUCTION  
Jackson, Mississippi  
February 7, 1961

1:30 P.M.

President Warren Gifford - Presiding

President Warren Gifford called the Annual Business Meeting of the Southern Section of the American Society of Animal Production to order at 1:30 P.M., February 7, 1961, in the Club Room of the King Edward Hotel, Jackson, Mississippi.

When the reading of the minutes of the last meeting was called for, P. B. Brown moved and L. S. Pope seconded that the reading of the minutes be dispensed with. Motion passed.

E. J. Warwick gave the Treasurer's report indicating that slightly over 100 members had paid dues of \$1.00 each and that expenditures totaled \$58.54. All members of the American Society of Animal Production in the Southern Section were circularized. Report accepted.

President Gifford called for old and new business. No matters were brought up under either category.

President Gifford called for the report of the Resolutions Committee which was as follows:

"Be it hereby resolved that the Animal Husbandry Section of the Fifty-Eighth Annual Convention of the Association of Southern Agricultural Workers express its appreciation to the management and employees of the King Edward Hotel for the facilities and assistance during the meetings of our section.

Be it further resolved that gratitude be expressed to members of the staff of Mississippi State University for assistance freely given to make this a successful meeting.

Be it further resolved that the Section Secretary and other officers be commended for the well prepared program and abstracts and the diligence with which the schedule has been maintained.

Be it further resolved that members presenting papers be congratulated for the quality of papers presented and their cooperation in maintaining the time schedule of the meetings.

Secretary - Dr. R. F. Wheeler, Clemson College, Clemson, S. C."


M. L. Ray moved and B. L. Southwell seconded that this slate of officers be elected by acclamation. Motion passed.

President Gifford reported briefly on a conference held by members of the Executive Committee and several past Presidents, the evening of February 6, 1961. He reported that at this meeting Dr. C. M. Kincaid and Dr. C. S. Hobbs had been assigned the task of writing up a set of rules for operating the Southern Section. They will make their report at a later date, presumably at the annual meeting next year. He also reported that possible joint sessions for next year had been discussed at this meeting and that it had been tentatively decided, subject to approval of the membership, to attempt to develop a joint session with the Agronomy and Dairy Sections on forage utilization. There being apparent agreement with the idea, the Animal Husbandry Vice-President was instructed to explore the idea with the other sections. A possible teaching section had also been discussed at the meeting and is a definite possibility for the future.

There being no further business, the regular program of Technical papers was resumed.

During the three day meeting, February 6 through noon on the 8th, a total of 60 technical papers were presented to the group. A total of 111 persons signed the attendance register (list attached) and it is probable that other persons attended a part of the sessions but failed to sign the roll.
