UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT ORAL PAPER COMPETITION MIDWESTERN SECTION, AMERICAN SOCIETY OF ANIMAL SCIENCE MIDWEST BRANCH, AMERICAN DAIRY SCIENCE ASSOCIATION[®]

Approved July 30, 1986 Amended July 1988, September 1992, September 1993, August 1997, March 1999, September 2007, and August 2009

Purpose

The purpose of the Undergraduate Student Paper Competitions are to provide an opportunity for undergraduate students to gain experience in reviewing, discovering, and presenting scientific information in a scholarly manner on a topic of current importance and interest to the animal industry.

Rules and Regulations

1. Contestants must be enrolled as an undergraduate student in an institution within the ASAS Midwestern Section or ADSA Midwest Branch[®] which offers a baccalaureate degree in Agriculture at the time of abstract submission. The contestant or the advisor must be a member of either ASAS or ADSA[®]. Undergraduate students enrolled in institutions outside of the Midwest region or at institutions that do not offer degrees in Agriculture may also enter the competition as long as either the student or the advisor is a member of the ASAS Midwestern Section or the ADSA[®] Midwest Branch.

2. There is no limit as to the number of students that can participate from one college/university.

3. Students with papers that are in the oral competition may also choose to present their papers in their discipline's regular program of presentations.

4. An individual student may enter only one competitive paper in either the oral or poster division. Additional papers may be submitted for non-competitive presentation in appropriate disciplinary sections.

5. The appropriate box indicating undergraduate student oral competition must be marked at the time of electronic submission and the abstract must be submitted by October 27, 2010 11:59 pm CDT.

6. The project supervisor's name should be included as an author on the paper.

7. A copy of the submitted abstract and the tracking number must be received by Dr. Bryon R. Wiegand, University of Missouri, 920 E. Campus Drive, S108 ASRC, Columbia, MO 65211-5300; email <u>wiegandb@missouri.edu</u> or fax 573-882-6827 no later than October 29, 2010.

8. Competitors must upload their presentations to the FASS Abstract System prior to the competition. More information will be available in January.

9. Students are required to attend the Awards Breakfast on Wednesday March 16, 2011.

Subject Matter

The paper must include original research in which the student was involved at a level appropriate for an undergraduate student.

Location and Setting

1. Papers will be presented at the Midwest ASAS/ADSA Annual Meeting in the appropriate topic section.

Time Limit

1. The oral presentation must be a minimum of nine (9) minutes in length and a maximum of twelve (12) minutes.

2. At the completion of each paper, there will be questions from the audience and/or judges.

3. Total time for the oral presentation and the discussion should not exceed fifteen (15) minutes.

Visual Aids

1. PowerPoint slides may depict data, graphs, illustrations, or any other material that might enhance the oral presentation.

2. LCD units, projection screen, and a pointer are provided.

Procedure for Entering

1. An abstract of the paper with title and name(s) of author(s) etc. must be submitted electronically like all other abstracts. The abstract should be prepared according to the format used for abstracts of scientific papers and submitted no later than October 27, 2010. In addition, a printed copy of the electronic submission and tracking number must be received by Dr. Bryon R. Wiegand, University of Missouri, 920 E. Campus Drive, S108 ASRC, Columbia, MO 65211-5300; email wiegandb@missouri.edu or fax 573-882-6827 no later than October 29, 2010. The abstracts will be circulated to the judging committee prior to the competition. Abstracts that have been evaluated and rejected by the section chair cannot be revised and re-submitted as a competitive paper by the author.

2. Entrants in the Undergraduate Student Oral Paper Competition will be listed in the Midwest annual meeting program booklet.

3. In the case of multiple-author presentations, in the abstract designate the presenter's name with an asterisk (*).

4. There is no limit on the number of undergraduates from one institution presenting undergraduate research papers. However, an individual student is limited to entering only one competitive paper in either the oral or poster competition.

Awards

1. Cash awards will be presented to the three entrants receiving the highest point totals (first, \$300; second, \$200; and third, \$100).

2. Winners will be announced and cash awards presented at the Midwest ASAS/ADSA[®] Annual Awards and Business Meeting.

3. Plaques will be presented to the winners after the meeting.
